PROPOSED
AMENDMENT

Article III.
Section 2.
Clause 2.

Resolved that the below mentioned clause be reformed to read as follows and that this reformed clause replace the one now standing; (see present clause in your copy of the "Troop Leaders Manual".) Sec.--

A. Nominations in any official council camp may be made in the following ratio:

- a. Camps with registrations of 14 or less Scouts. 1 nominee.
- b. Camps with registrations of 15 thru' 24 Scouts. 2 nominees.
- c. Camps with registrations of 25 thru' 34 Scouts. 3 nominees.
- d. Camps with registrations of 35 thru' 44 Scouts. 4 nominees.

This ratio may be continued in like manner as demonstrated, with the increase of registrations in camp.

B. These nominations may be made by the active members of the Order, then in camp, at the end of any camp period.

C. The name, address, troop number and the Scoutmaster's name and address of each nominee, must be in the hands of the secretary of the Order, within three days after the nomination.

D. The Secretary will mail to nominee's Scoutmaster, the Performance Record to be completed.
