LODGE NEWS

The requirements for membership in the Golden Sun Lodge, Order of the Arrow are: (1) be in attendance at a full session of any council promoted camp; (2) show evidence of leadership and high personal character; (3) hold at least three merit badges—to be either camping, cooking, pioneering, nature, swimming merit badges, or any one of the citizenship merit badge group—one of the merit badges the candidate holds must be either camping, cooking, or pioneering. A reminder should be made that the OA is not a rank and completing the requirements does not mean that a Scout will automatically become a member.

This is the proper way to wear the insignia of the lodge and of the order: with the uniform, the custom has been to wear the black with gold trim neckerchief, and we shall to continue to abide by this custom. The only official OA insignia to be worn with the uniform at all times is the universal arrow badge. The OA sash worn about the body like the merit badge sash is worn only at official functions of the OA. You can wear the lodge Golden Sun pin on the ribbon of the universal arrow badge. For civilian wear there is a arrow lapel pin available. Prices for those interested are:
