In Memoriam: Theodore G. Kimball, beloved Scouter, passed away on October 10, 1953. Ted had touched the lives of over 300 boys in the nine years he was in the Scout program. He became Cubmaster of Pack 5 in 1945 and Scoutmaster of Troop 5 in 1946. For several years he had both positions. He has served on District and Council Committees as well. He was an expert in handicraft and helped many a Cub leader in Lincoln and over the entire Council. He attended the National Jamboree in 1950, serving as an assistant Scoutmaster. He also served as merit badge counselor for Leather Work, Woodwork, Wood Carving, Stamp Collecting, and Coin Collecting. He was advisor for the Golden Sun for two years, faithfully attending all meetings as long as he was a member. While Ted is no longer with us, the effect of his good works will remain forever in the memories of those that had the pleasure of knowing him. He made for himself a monument that even time cannot erase.

A LETTER FROM THE CHIEF

Dear Brother Sun,

Summer camp is approaching. By now the leader in your unit has probably discussed the opportunities for attending camp with your unit. Summer camp will concern you as a Sun in four ways.

(1) Camp Promotion: By this time each Chapter officer and District leader in your area has some general information on Camp Promotion and promotional meetings. This year, as a trial, we would like to see as many CA promotional teams as possible visit troop meetings, preferably on parents night, and stage a program which will encourage more boys to attend camp. If you are interested in working on one of these teams, contact your chapter officers. You can also help by personally promoting the attendance of your troop at camp.

(2) Camp Staff: One of the first obligations of the Golden Suns when they organized in 1923 was to furnish the camp staff for the council camp. I feel that this is still one of our most important duties. The fact that you are an OA man will give you some prestige in obtaining a position on the staff. We cannot restrict staff membership to OA members, but we can have an OA staff if enough OA men apply.

(3) Camp Leadership: Of course there is not room for 400 OA men on the camp staffs, and undoubtedly many Suns will be working elsewhere during the summer. I would like to encourage each Sun to plan to attend at least part of one week of camp. If possible attend camp as an assistant leader-helping out your Scoutmaster; if not, try to attend for a day or two-helping with a troop campfire, etc.

(4) Tapping: As usual, the tapping ceremony will be held on Thursday nights at camp. There is a definite need for at least four adult and six Scout members for conducting the ceremony. Staff members generally fill a good share of these positions, but I would like to encourage you
