### TRIBAL COUNCIL MEETS, PLANS FOR SUMMER CAMPING

The officers met Friday night in the scout office and decided upon the following program and policies:

(1) Dues statements are to be sent out September 1, of each year. The dues must be paid by January 1 of the following year. (have you paid yours?).

(2) A complete and detailed financial report will be given in the first SUNDIAL following January 1, of each year.

(3) Sundials are to be sent bi-monthly starting Sept. 1 and continuing through May, with an issue before camp and a mid-summer (initiation) issue.

(4) A complete inventory of headress, costumes and any other lodge items will be published in the September and May issues of the SUNDIAL.

(5) There should be at least one activity for the order other than the initiations during the year. If you have any suggestions please put them on the bottom of the form on page 3 when you return it.

(6) Council activities such as Train Trips, Camporees, etc. will be mentioned in the SUNDIAL and you will be expected to give full support to those in your area whenever possible.

Here in the office we don't have as much information concerning the local activities of the lodge. We can only assume that if it is anything like the membership, it won't be but a few years before we have no Order of the Arrow in the Cornhusker Council, BSA.

At Camp Minis Kuya the first week of August of this year, we initiated more than 60 new members into the order. This group alone comprises almost one-half of the mailing list of the lodge.

This year at summer camp we are going to need a team of 15 men and boys for each of the councils camps. Assuming that camp will run eight weeks at the Reservation and six weeks at Minis Kuya, and that five of each team of 15 will be on the staff, it will leave us with a need for 140 men and boys outside of the camp staffs to handle the load for tapping. If you want to keep the Order of the Arrow, start now by taking an active part. Talk up the OA in your local troop.
