An entirely new type of initiation was held. Although the initiation was essentially the same, the parts played in it by the Lodge members was altered considerably, to include more of our local Arrowmen.

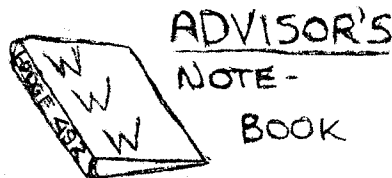
Let us take a minute to congratulate those Arrowmen who were this years candidates.
