



# WACISA INDIANS

We welcome into the Cornhusker Council, a new organization, the Wacisa Indian Dancers. They were formed in late January, 1958. The Dancers then elected a Board of Directors consisting of adult leaders in the scouting program, and a constitution was adopted.

The group began work on dances and costumes immediately and within 2 months after starting rehearsals, the group appeared on Channel 12, TV. Since that time the Dancers have appeared in many performances, such as the O.A. Winter Event and Irving Berlin's "Annie Get Your Gun, and also featured a booth at the Scout Exposition.

The Dancers have two separate tribes within the organization. One group is made up of dancers and the other group is in charge of drumming and chanting.

The purposes of the Wacisa Indian Dancers is to recreate Indian Dances and art in as authentic a manner as possible, to develop good boy leadership, and many other outstanding qualities of character.

The organization is financed by dues

paid by the boy, two dollars a year, and by the income of shows, as well as donations. All funds in excess of operating funds are given to the Cornhusker Council Camps.

Any Scout or Explorer who has attained the rank of First Class Scout or over and whose grades in school are average or above is eligible for membership in the Wacisa Indian Dancers.

The boys rehearse once a week and it is arranged so that the boy will not miss any school.

The organization expects each and every boy to advance to the rank of Eagle, at which time he will become a chief, the highest post in the Dancers.
