

ARTICLE V - Amendments

This constitution may be amended only at the annual Pow-Wow of the Lodge by a two-thirds majority vote of the tribesmen present. All proposed amendments must be published to the Lodge one month prior to the Pow-Wow.

PROPOSED BY-LAWS OF THE GOLDEN SUN LODGE

ARTICLE I - Officers

Section 1. The officers of this Lodge and its chapters must not have passed their twenty-first birthday at the time of their election, except for the Lodge and Chapter Advisors, who must be at least twenty-one at the time of their election.

Section 2. The elective Lodge and Chapter Officers shall be elected each year by the Annual Pow-Wow of the Lodge. Chapter officers shall be elected according to chapter rules.

Section 3. The Tribal Council will prepare a slate of nominations for each Lodge elective office. These nominations must be published in the Lodge newsletter at least two weeks before the Annual Pow-Wow. Further nominations shall be accepted at the Pow-Wow.

Section 4. It will be necessary for a candidate to have a simple majority of votes cast in his election to be considered elected to an elective office. An officer may succeed himself any number of times.

ARTICLE II - Duties of the Officers

Section 1. Supreme Chief of the Fire shall be responsible for the Lodge in this Council. He shall appoint a liaison executive to serve the Lodge. He shall approve the Lodge Advisor. He shall perform such other duties as his office may require.

Section 2. Camp Chief of the Fire shall settle all disputes concerning the Golden Sun Lodge that occur in his camp. He shall assist the Camp Council in carrying out their program. He shall perform such other duties as his office may require.

Section 3. Lodge Chief shall give supervision to the Lodge and its officers, and see that its constitutional duties and obligations, national and local, are fulfilled. He shall preside at all meetings of the Lodge and the Tribal Council, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. He shall appoint the regular committee chairmen and see to it that the committee personnel is properly selected. He shall appoint any special committees necessary for expediency in carrying out the program of the Lodge. He shall perform such other duties as his office may require.

Section 4. Assistant Lodge Chief shall be responsible for all physical arrangements for all Lodge meetings. He shall perform all of the Lodge Chief's functions in the absence of the Lodge Chief. He shall supervise and be responsible for all ceremony teams. He shall perform such other duties as his office may require.

Section 5. Lodge Secretary shall keep an accurate written record of the proceedings of all Lodge meetings, Tribal Council meetings, and committee meetings. He shall issue all Lodge notices and invitations, carry on all necessary correspondence with the National Office, and he shall cooperate in sending the Lodge newsletter to all members. He shall have custody of all copies of all rituals. He shall perform such other duties as his office may require.
