

Section 6. Lodge Treasurer shall receive all money of the Lodge and keep an accurate record thereof. He shall deposit all of the Lodge's receipts with the Lodge's account with the Cornhusker Council. He shall diligently collect all membership dues. He shall authorize payments of the Lodge's money from the Lodge's account by the Cornhusker Council and keep an accurate record thereof. He shall have the financial books of the Lodge properly audited at the close of his term of office. He shall make reports of the condition of the Lodge Treasury to the Lodge meetings and to meetings of the Tribal Council. He shall be responsible for the safe keeping of all physical property of the Lodge. He shall perform such other duties as his office may require.

Section 7. Lodge Advisor shall be responsible for auditing the Treasurer's books, and shall see that said audit is performed at least once each calendar year. He shall attend meetings regularly and serve as advisor and counselor at all times to the Lodge, its members, and its officers. He shall give leadership to getting the program and administration of the Lodge underway at the beginning of each new administration. He shall perform such other duties as his office may require.

ARTICLE III - Tribal Council

Section 1. The authority of the Tribal Council shall rest in the newly elected Lodge officers and Chapter Chiefs and Assistant Chapter Chiefs. Each shall have one vote. All old members of the Tribal Council will act in an advisory capacity only. No business shall be transacted unless at least seven voting members of the Tribal Council are present.

Section 2.

A) The Tribal Council shall exercise all the powers of legislation of the Lodge during the intervals between regular Lodge meetings.

B) The Tribal Council shall advise the Lodge Chief in the coordination of all Lodge functions.

C) The Tribal Council shall analyze any particular problems of the Lodge pertaining to program or administration and plan for their solution.

D) The Tribal Council shall serve as finance committee of the Lodge, setting up and operating the Lodge budget.

E) The Tribal Council shall serve as the nomination committee of the Lodge.

F) The Tribal Council shall maintain the traditions and customs of the Lodge, and shall keep the members informed of them.

G) The Tribal Council shall appoint an editor of the Lodge Newsletter, "The Sundial" who shall be responsible for the periodic publication of the newsletter. At least one month before the Annual Pow-Wow, "The Sundial" shall be published to the entire membership of the Lodge, both active and inactive. This issue will contain nominations for the officers of the Lodge, notice of Lodge dues, proposed amendments to the constitution and by-laws, a list of current officers, a list of the Tribal Council, requests for the self-denial fund, and a resume of Lodge activities since the last annual newsletter. Other issues shall be published when necessary.

ARTICLE IV - Camp Council

Section 1. The Tribesmen present in a Cornhusker Council long-term camp shall comprise the Camp Council. The leadership of the Camp Council shall be selected by the Tribal Council. The Camp Council will be responsible for the conduction of the Calling Out ceremony.

Section 2. The Camp Council shall work closely with the Camp Chief of the Fire in carrying out all activities of the Lodge in Camp.
