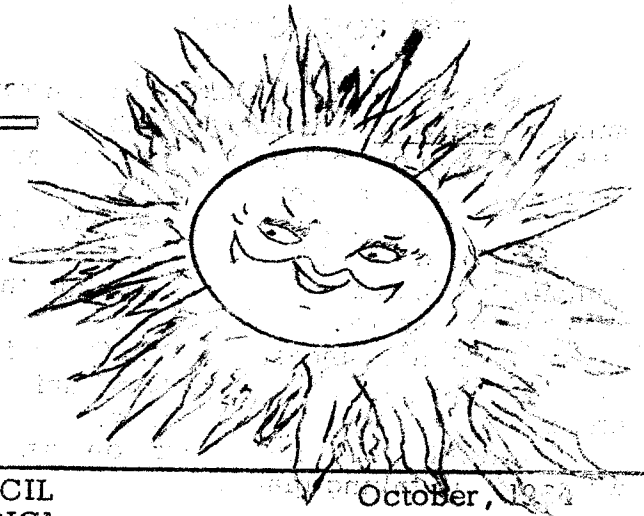

JAMBOREE POW WOW

The 50th Anniversary celebration of the founding of the Order of the Arrow was officially begun at the National Jamboree, at Valley Forge, Pa., July 19, 1964.

Dr. E. Urner Goodman, founder of the Order, Challenged all Arrowmen to continue to grow in cheerful service during this golden year. He also reminded the Scouts that the ultimate test of the Order is the finished product...and that they, the members, are the finished product.

It was announced that the National Order of the Arrow Conference will be held at Indiana University, Bloomington, Indiana, August 27-30, 1965.

A special ceremony will be held at Treasure Island, the birthplace of the Order, to commemorate the semi-centennial. As a special project, a record of the achievements of the Order will be presented to the President of the United States and to the governors of the 50 states.

The Pow Wow was concluded with the highest ranking member of each lodge present coming up on the arena stage and repeating, along with the 12,000 Arrowmen present, the OA Obligation. Jim Cook, National Jamboree, Troop 63, represented our lodge.
