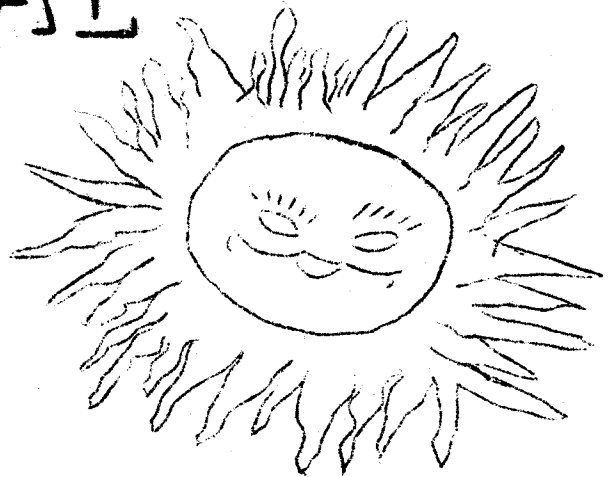

### COSTUME REQUIREMENTS for ALL LODGE MEMBERS

In order to maintain an Indian atmosphere at lodge ceremonies it is necessary that all members of our lodge dress as a tribe of Indians. Dressing like one tribe implies a certain amount of uniformity in costuming which does not now exist. This article is meant to answer any questions which you may have concerning the new costume requirements set at a recent meeting of the lodge costume committee.

All costumes, except those of specially appointed ceremonial characters, will be made of the lodge colors, black and gold. Breechclothes, leggings and vests may be made of any black material.

Breechclothes will be rectangular in shape. They must be black with a border of gold. (Material tape works well for this purpose.) The lodge totum, a three-inch, twelve-pointed sun, must be worn in the lower right hand corner of the breechcloth, three inches from the corner. A personal totum, not larger than three inches, may be worn in the upper left hand corner, three inches from the corner. Both lodge and personal totums must be gold in color.

Vests may be worn by all members of the lodge. Vests must be black with a gold border. Only personal totums may be worn on the vests and any bead work must be of plain style.

Leggings may not be worn by Ordeal members. Leggings must be of plain Indian style and made of black material with gold borders.

Swimming suits may be worn under breechclothes or aprons. All swimming suits must be black.

The only acceptable foot wear is moccasins or black or brown shoes. **NO TENNIS SHOES PLEASE!**

Bells, necklaces, etc., may be worn by all members. War bonnets may only be worn by prescribed ceremonial parts and lodge officers.

The one exception to the above listed rules is that those Brotherhood or Vigil members that have no ceremonial parts may wear any amount of desired costume refinements and accessories so long as the primary costume remains black and gold.
