

50th ANNIVERSARY AWARD

Recently, questions have been pouring in to several members of the Tribal Council concerning the 50th Anniversary Award of the Order of the Arrow. Each member should by now have a scoreboard explaining the requirements for this award. These problems, concerning the signing of the card, are in three areas.

First, it is necessary for the Lodge Treasurer, Bob Woodford, to sign the requirement on O. A. dues since there are no Chapter dues. This will be easily taken care of at the "65" Pow Wow, when you pay your dues.

Secondly, the service project area has caused problems. Any member of the Tribal Council, which includes all Lodge & Chapter officers, and Committee Chairman & Advisors may sign the card. Also, any Council or District Executive or the Camp Ranger may sign the card for this requirement. Since the O. A. is based somewhat on the "ideal" of committee participation by all members, committee work is "not" acceptable for this award. To all Ordeal members, it should be made clear that you do not have to work 10 hours cheerfully for your Brotherhood and then an additional 6 hours for this award. If all other requirements are passed, ten hours of service will earn you both the award and the Brotherhood rank.

The third trouble spot is that our fearless lodge advisor, Mr. Herb Kimball, must sign all cards. Therefore, arrangements have been made so that all Arrowmen are to send their cards, when all other signatures have been obtained, to Mr. Herb Kimball. His address is 2817 "F" Street, Lincoln, Nebraska. Everybody should try to earn this award so that the Lodge may also be honored.

Just Remember--Get all the signatures, and send the card to Mr. Kimball before November 1, 1965, when the award expires.
