Plans are to leave Lincoln early Friday morning, August 22, and travel to Springfield, Illinois, tour Lincoln's birthplace, and spend the night in a Springfield motel.

Bloomington, Indiana and the National Conference will be the next stop. The conference lasts from August 23 to the 26, at the University of Indiana.

Leaving Bloomington, the arrowmen will travel to Peoria, Illinois, spend the night there, and return to Lincoln August 27.

The fee for the trip is \$85.00. This covers transportation, lodging and the conference fee.

The adults fee will be paid in part by the Lodge. The transportation and lodging will be paid for.

LODGE DRUM AND TEE PEE FINISHED, MANY ARROWMEN WORK
TO LEND EFFECT OF AUTHENTICITY TO LODGE CEREMONIES

The drum and Tee Pee have now been added to the Tap Out ceremony at the Reservation.

Constructed by Mr. Marshall, Scott Marshall and others, they add quite a bit to the ceremonies.

A special thank you goes to Mr. Myron Armintrout, a Lodge member, who sewed the canvas for the Tee Pee.

Anyone who has seen the Tee Pee and drum can say thank you to those who helped to construct two such fine articles.

The Tee Pee is full size, is painted red, blue, and white, and is circled by a yellow sun formation.

The Tee Pee, is a Sioux, about 14 feet.

The Drum is yellow and black. The Drum head is yellow and the base is black.

The head is decorated with the same design as that on the neckerchief slide which is black and gold.

Mr. Gilbert Reinke donated the metal poles for the drum stand.

Poles for the Tee Pee are still few. Some 25 are needed. They must be at least 20 feet tall, straight as an arrow, and about four inches at the base.
