## Lodge Issues Anniversary Flap

Shortly after the boundaries of the current Cornhusker Council were set, it was obvious a location for a new Boy Scout Camp was needed within those boundaries. On September 20, 1955 a decision was made to purchase 40 acres of land (with an option to purchase 700 more acres) south of Humboldt, Nebraska. On June 10, 1956 the Cornhusker Scout Reservation opened its first Boy Scout Summer Camp with over 600 scouts attending the Reservation that first summer. The camp was officially dedicated on October 28, 1956 at the end of a Council-wide Camporee held at the Cornhusker Scout Reservation.

In honor of Camp Cornhusker's 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, the Golden Sun Lodge will be issuing a Camp Cornhusker 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Commemorative Lodge Flap. This flap will go on sale for the first time at the Pow Wow held at Camp Cornhusker on August 12, 2005. Only 300 flaps have been ordered.



In addition, the first 25 flaps will have numbers embroidered on the flap making them one-of-a-kind issues. The "First 25" flaps will be auctioned off to the highest bidder via our website starting after the Pow-Wow. See the website for the details on how this will work.

The profit from the sales of these Commemorative Flaps will be used for improving the camping facilities at Camp Cornhusker so make sure you get yours at either the 2005 Pow Wow or the auction for the "First 25" Lodge Flaps.
